Here's our past couple of weeks in Review!

Writing

We're happy to report that on Monday (12/5/05) we are getting a new student! The scholars are really excited about this and have spent much of their writing time in *welcoming* the new friend. They've written small "booklets" to introduce themselves and have changed the format for the blog/podcast in order to focus on "welcoming members" to the community (not just the new student, but anyone who would join us). The

students decided what things would be important to share for someone joining Room 208.

Students have also been working on some new Poetry forms: "Creature Alliteration" and the "5 Sense Poem". Look for these on the poetry website.

Skills have included: **Subject Pronouns, Object Pronouns, Commas in a Series,** and **Singular and Plural Nouns**.

Reading

We all really enjoyed our "Read-In" the day before Thanksgiving. We started reading Winnie the Pooh, which the students found out they enjoyed more than they thought they would! Elizabeth brought in a wonderful collection of books by Ursula K. LeGuin, called Catwings which we have also been enjoying.

We've recently read the story, *The Great* Kapok Tree by Lynne Cherry. The students are practicing a "readers' theater" script of the story and a small group of students are in the process of writing Cherry to see if they can perform the script on the Podcast.

Skills included: Cause & Effect, Syllabication, and Figurative Language.

Math

3rd graders are working on Multiplication & Division. They learned how to play the excellent game, Baseball Multiplication. Ask them to play this with you at home!

4th graders are well into their unit on Decimals. They've learned how to work with numbers

in the thousandths this week. They also practiced measurement using the metric system.

Science

Students spent time this week dissecting Owl Pellets. They really enjoyed this! They used a chart to identify what animal the owl

ate, and even "reassembled" the bones of the animal. Next, students will use the information/ observations to further examine the owls' habitat.

On Wednesday, I was in Nashua, NH at the **Christa McAuliffe Technology Conference** sharing the work of the scholars. People were




just amazed at the great work the students are doing. People from **Apple** told me they are constantly sharing the students' show during their workshops.
