It's been a very busy couple of weeks in Room 208! Students have been working very hard on so many things, trying to wrap up projects and writing before the holiday break.

Writing

We've continued with poetry and students have learned several new forms: *Sense Poems, Creature Alliteration Poems* (which taught the technique of *allit*- *eration*), and *Personification Poems* (which taught students how to personify an inanimate object). These poems will hopefully be on our *Poetry Blog* soon.

A group of students really went the distance this week on a current events topic about *Wikipedia* (an online encyclopedia). In two groups, they worked several days getting a report together for the Podcast. I am simply "blown away" by the level of writing and sophistication that the students are showing in their podcast pieces. This piece is incredibly thoughtful and articulate. We've been reading some wonderful stories lately about taking care of the earth. The conversations around these texts have been out-

standing and students have been reflecting on them in their Journal Letters to me as well.

Students spent time reading poems on Thursday in order to find examples of *Personification*, in order to support their work in Writing.

Math

The 4th graders have just finished their Unit 4 on *Decimals and their Uses*. I will be sending home the reports from their assessments next week. They are now working on *Big Numbers, Estimation, and Compu*-

tation. This week, they've learned how to *extend multiplication facts* (i.e., knowing 5 X 6 helps me know 5×60), as well as how to *Multiplication Wrestle* (a great way to multiply multi-digit numbers).

3rd graders have just finished their unit on *Multiplication & Division* and are now moving into their unit on *Place Value in Whole Numbers & Decimals.* cactus with the oak tree that we had learned about earlier.
